As you know, it is to be hosted by the Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society (RA&HS) of South Australia this year and will be held during the Royal Adelaide Show. With the opportunity to tell the "story of alpaca" to many thousands of people every day, our focus has been to ensure that we:

- 1. Convene a great halter and fleece competition, showcasing the best of the best of our wonderful alpaca
- 2. Optimize the chance to tell the story of alpaca to both the public and the large contingent of agribusiness who also attend the Royal Adelaide Show

Important Dates:

- Entries will open on Friday 10th June 2022
- Entries will close on Friday 8th July 2022
- Fleeces entries to be delivered by Friday 22nd July 2022
- Art, craft, and Photography entries to be delivered by Friday 22nd July 2022
- Halter entries will "bump-in" on Friday 2nd September 2022 between 8:00am and 7:30pm
- Halter judging will take place from Saturday 3rd to Monday 5th September 2002
- Halter entries will "bump-out" after the conclusion of judging on Monday 5th September 2022, or early on Tuesday 6th September 2022 (or later in the day on Tuesday 6th September, by arrangement)
- Youth events to be conducted on Tuesday 6th September 2022
