GENERAL INFORMATION AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Entry and Declarations- Entry is via eAlpaca only. Completed Movement Forms must be sent to the convenors prior to entering the showgrounds, via email to yackaridge@bigpond.com.

Please note:

- Showing of alpacas will be in accordance with the rules, regulations and conditions of the Australian Alpaca Association's Showing Rules and conditions of entry as specified by the AAA-SA Region, insofar as is possible. Exhibitors must comply with the rules regarding eligibility. (please check national website for any changes to rules)
- **A completed Camelid Waybill must be sent to the Convenors upon entry being submitted. Copy attached below.**
- Approved showing classes are as per eAlpaca. Classes may be split or combined if numbers warrant.
- The show will be held in the Sheep Pavilion, which is located opposite our usual showing shed.
- Vehicles and trailer will be required to be parked away from the Farmers Market and the Sheep Pavilion on the day.
- Gates to the show grounds are open at all times. All alpacas are to be penned by 8.30 a.m. and **must remain penned until inspection has been completed**. No swapping or altering of pens is permitted.
- The Mt Pleasant Farmers Market will be operating between 8.00 and 12 midday, so please take this into consideration in your planning. There will be vehicular traffic in and out of the adjacent area.
- Judging of alpacas should commence by 9:00 a.m., with Suri animal classes first, alternating with Huacaya classes.
- It is expected an early lunch will be taken at around 11.00 am to take advantage of the food stalls at the Farmers Market. BYO food is permitted.
- Sire's Progeny classes will be for any two progeny of one sire. Minimum of two entries for the class to run. Nominations taken on the day.
- All exhibitors must remain until the judging has been completed, and are expected to assist with breakdown and packing of penning and other equipment (unless health or disability precludes this).
- No advertisements, displays or notices are permitted in or on any pens or structures, with the exception of one stud banner/sign per exhibitor, the dimensions of which is not to exceed 1200mm x 600mm, and to be placed no higher than the pen height.
- Withdrawals should be notified to the Convener at the earliest possible time.

Dress Code:

Black shirts, black pants or trousers, along with black or dark coloured enclosed shoes/boots. No runners or sandals will be permitted in the ring.

- ! **Please note:** Dogs are not permitted within the confines of the shed or show ring whilst alpacas are present.
- ! **Vehicles:** Only Authorised vehicles may remain in the area of the shed, all other vehicles must be removed to the carpark (southern end of showgrounds) as soon as animals and equipment are unloaded.

*When more than one truck is carrying the camelids, other vehicle registration numbers are to be recorded

SOUTH AMERICAN CAMELID DECLARATION AND WAYBILL - EXPLANATORY NOTES

South American camelids are alpacas, llamas, vicunas, and guanacos.

Section 2 – Biosecurity introductions

Drive-by mating is taking a female to the property on which the male resides, conducting the mating, and leaving immediately afterwards.

Mobile mating is taking the male to the property on which the female resides, conducting the mating, and leaving immediately afterwards.

The visiting camelid MUST NOT reside at the receiving farm.

Introduction of camelids to your property of unknown disease status exposes your herd to potential risk. You should always obtain a written declaration of the health status of introduced animals. The use of quarantine provisions before introduction of other livestock to your herd is recommended.

Section 3 – Johne's disease

Q Alpaca: a voluntary alpaca quality assurance program maintained by the Australian Alpaca Association.

Check tested: A negative pooled faecal culture test of 50 adults in a herd (one-year-of-age and over), or all eligible animals in a herd of less than 50 adult animals, in which there is no suspicion of infection.

Lifetime history known for all animals being consigned: Unless all of the properties, and the animal health status (e.g. JD) of those properties, where the camelids in this consignment have resided since birth are known, this question should be answered 'No'. Good herd records should be kept for both purchased and homebred animals to justify answering 'Yes'.

Section 7 – Restricted Animal Material (RAM)

RAM includes any tissue, blood or other material taken from an animal and any meals derived from animals. Examples are meat and bone meals, blood meal, fish meal, feather meal etc. It does not include tallow, gelatine or milk products of Australian origin. Contact your State or Territory Department of Agriculture or Primary Industries for more details on these feeding restrictions.

Section 8 – Cattle tick

Parts of Queensland, Northern Territory and Western Australia are declared under the relevant state legislation as Cattle Tick Infected/Infested Zones. All other parts of Australia are Cattle Tick Free Zones. Section 8 is mandatory for camelids moving:

- From a Cattle Tick Infected/Infested Zone unless to another Cattle Tick Infected/Infested Zone
- From a property in the Free Zone with cattle tick infestation
- Between some states (please check with the local animal health officer).

Interstate movements

Owners planning to move camelids interstate should check the destination state's entry requirements well in advance of moving the animals. Testing or further certification may be required.
